When is it?

Friday, March 15 to Sunday, March 17

Arrival: If you are from the BV, Philly, or D.C. chapter, please arrive at 7 p.m. (3/15). Pittsburgh, we understand you have a bit of a drive, so come as close to 7 p.m. as you can!

Departure: Camp ends at 10:30 a.m. (3/17).

How?

Arrival by car or bus

What to pack

- Water bottle
- Flashlight
- Sneakers/ closed-toe shoes
- Clothes for 3 days (+ a jacket)
- PJs
- Spending money (there will be a chance to buy CISV merchandise from different chapters!)
- Sleeping bags or bedding (we have mattresses, but you need to bring your own blanket and pillows)
- Toiletries (soap, toothbrush, toothpaste, shampoo...)
- Towel
- Medication, including allergy medicine (please give all required medications to the adult camp staff during check-in)
- Camera
- **MOST IMPORTANT:**
YLF or ALIF and Health Form (you MUST bring these forms!!!!)

What not to pack

- Anything you wouldn't want to lose
- No nuts or nut-based products!

Meals:

We will be serving breakfast, lunch and dinner on Saturday. Only breakfast will be served on Sunday. There will be no dinner Friday night and no lunch Sunday afternoon. Please plan accordingly!

Chaperone Policy:

Chaperones are required for this event, and can be anyone who is 21+ with background clearances. Each chapter must provide one chaperone for every 6 participants. If you are having trouble finding chaperones, please contact Liddy Grossman and Rachel Cohen (contact information down below).

Registration and Cost:

MARMC is \$130.

Unfortunately, there are a limited number of spaces, and we will be letting kids come to MARMC on a first-come/first-serve basis by pre-registering.

So make sure to sign up before you #JurassiCAN'T!

Each chapter in the region gets 18 spots for JB (and possibly more). If you plan to come to RMC, please make sure you pre-register. When the first 18 spots are filled, we will have a waiting list, and if you sign up for that, we will be in touch when additional spots open up.

In addition, each chapter must send one chaperone for every six JB, meaning we need the following:

1-6 JB = 1 chaperone

7-12 JB = 2 chaperones

13-18 JB = 3 chaperones

Once we have a headcount for each chapter, we'll send the registration/payment link to those who have signed up. If you're on the waiting list, we'll contact you **ASAP** to let you know if we have a spot for you. (JB will be taken from the waiting list in the order in which they are signed up.)

Everyone attending camp must print/fill out the correct forms, and have the ready to turn in at check-in Friday (3/15).

Participants under the age of 18 **MUST** fill out the YLF Domestic. Anyone 18+ **MUST** fill out the ALF Domestic. Both Forms are attached here.
