The following year, my oldest son participated in an Interchange with the Leeds, England, chapter. Not only did he have a great experience, but my whole family did too! We loved hosting his partner and getting to know the other children and families in the delegation. As things happen, the following year the chapter was in search of an Interchange coordinator, and I agreed to take on the role.



In the years that followed, I joined the board and volunteered on several committees, eventually stepping up to the chapter president position when Janet Reynolds was ready to pass the torch. Although I was nervous to take on the role, Janet was the best coach and helped me every step of the way. I stayed in the presidency role for three years before we instituted the policy that is in place today (one year as president-elect, one year as president, one year as past president) and that makes this important role so much more manageable to accept.

Over the years, my four children loved the international programs they attended but also benefited so much from the local JB meetings and events. The meetings focused on the topic areas of diversity, sustainability, conflict and resolution, and human rights and featured fun and thought-provoking activities, as did the local and national mini-camps they attended. They especially enjoyed the debriefs after each activity and felt like their contributions mattered. I think back with such fondness to the car rides home from those meetings and how excited the kids were to share what they learned and discussed. Although my kids are now grown adults, it's not uncommon for CISV memories to flood back when we get together. This truly makes my heart happy.

For me personally, I especially loved how CISV became a family experience—something we could all share together. (This wasn't the case with all the school clubs and sports in which they participated.) We chaperoned, hosted children, and attended picnics and potlucks together. We volunteered together for various meaningful causes, such as preparing 10,000 meals for Stop Hunger Now and promoting Peace Day. Attending the annual fall gala was an another fun experience that we all enjoyed.

My current position with the chapter is on the selection committee. Each year I am amazed by the intelligence and maturity of prospective delegates. It brings me hope that in these very trying times, CISV truly *is* making a difference—one child at a time—and that it will be these children will make the world a more peaceful place.

As you've read here, volunteering for CISV has positively affected my family in so many meaningful ways. If you have the opportunity to volunteer, I hope that you will. I believe you'll be glad you did.
